What is Marin Transit?

The Marin County Transit District (Marin Transit) was established by a vote of the people in Marin County in 1964 and was given the responsibility for providing local transportation services within Marin County.

What is Marin Access?

Marin Transit formed Marin Access in 2010 to focus on the challenges of transportation for community members who cannot or choose not to drive.

Marin Access programs are funded by Marin County's Measure AA and Measure B, and FTA Section 5310; developed by Marin Transit; and operated in partnership with Marin Transit contracted staff.

Is Marin Access Right for Me?

1 Are you a resident of Marin County and age 65+?

OR

2 Are you a resident of Marin County and do you have a disability that prevents you from using regular public buses?

If you can answer **YES** to one of these questions, then you are eligible for Marin Access programs and services!

Programs & Services

FOR ALL MARIN ACCESS RIDERS

Intro to Mobility

All new Marin Access clients receive a variety of subsidies and resources to help them understand their transportation options. Eligible participants receive a mobility wallet card with a one-time subsidy of up to \$200 for use with transportation providers of your choice, a 31-day pass to use on Marin Transit local bus service, and access to the Travel Navigator team for assistance and support.

Volunteer Driver

Give back to the people who help you get around!

The Volunteer Driver Reimbursement Program offers reimbursement for up to 100 miles per month for STAR (residents of Central and East Marin), and up to 400 miles per month for TRIP (residents of West Marin).

The current rate for reimbursement is \$0.70 per mile, available for you to share with a driver of your choice.

FOR RIDERS WITH INCOME BARRIERS

Marin Access Fare Assistance (MAFA)

Marin Access clients with income barriers can receive fare assistance. To qualify, clients must be enrolled in Medi-Cal or demonstrate annual income at or below the current Elder Economic Index.

Eligible participants receive the following:

- » A mobility wallet with a recurring subsidy of up to \$200 per month for use with transportation providers of your choice.
- » \$300 of credit per year to use for trips on local Paratransit and Marin Access Shuttles.
- » An annual pass to use Marin Transit local bus for free!

FOR RIDERS WITH DISABILITIES

Paratransit

Marin Access Paratransit provides pre-scheduled bus/van transportation for persons with disabilities who cannot independently use regular Marin Transit or Golden Gate Transit bus service some or all of the time.

With this service, riders who cannot access our regular fixed route bus service still have freedom to travel around Marin County and beyond.

Paratransit service is available during the same days and hours as Marin Transit local bus service or Golden Gate Transit regional (non-commute) bus service, within 3/4 mile of the routes. Rides are offered as shared ride, door-to-door service.
